Report of the Executive Director May 2016

- The last sampling event at the NBMUA Woodcliff Treatment Facility proved inconclusive and the vast majority of the data indicate that there is little or no removal of copper. Copper is a metal that our facility is pending a limit that cannot be met through the traditional treatment methods at the Koelle Boulevard Facility.
- Contract specifications went out to re-bid for the purchase and installation of the dual fuel converter {on Agenda for this meeting}.
- The Authority's Environmental/Regulatory Engineering firm PS&S has been assisting with the documentation/submittals for the grant(s) funding.
- Gabel Associates has responded that the possibility of another array of solar panels that would not be advantageous to attract a third party contractor at no cost to the Authority.
- Continued contact with the Town regarding the possible connection of the USCG Auxiliary building to the SMUA sanitary on Meadowland Parkway.
- Yard hydrant has been replaced & removed the existing units. No further action on the conduit.
- Met with Chuck and Glenn to discuss what would be needed in regards to drawings for the placement of conduit runs and MCC panels. We have a meeting scheduled for June 14, 2016.

- Met with the members of the NJHDG to discuss plans moving forward to supply regulatory agencies with analytical data in an effort to prove a reduction in discharge limitations is appropriate and discussed the proposed contract.
- Started a fourth cycle application of Strike, the lavacide to reduce fly population and the installation of screens on each vent of the trickling filters has been completed. This has resulted in a drastic reduction of fly population.
- Started replacement of the influent valves for primary clarifiers #3 and 4. The isolation valve for these units was damaged and my need to be replaced.
- Met with Local 11 regarding labor negotiations. Another meeting is scheduled for June.

Regarding the copper issue G. Pascarello inquired if the plant would require a major overhaul. J. Napolitano stated "no" and added that our water has a dissolved oxygen issue. Also, said that the permit was for 5 years.

The valve replacement was discussed at length. Chairman Vogel questioned how it was broken. G. Beckmeyer gave details. Discussion was had regarding the possible ways to correct. F. Vogel asked about inspection of valves. G. Beckmeyer said there a schedule for "exercising" the valves. J. Napolitano added that the schedule/process was being reviewed.

Regarding Local 11, J. Napolitano agreed to send the notes showing the updates to the commissioners.

SECAUCUS MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY ENGINEER'S REPORT MAY 2016

The following is a list of the main activities as provided by this office to the Authority for the above-mentioned month:

O Started design and specifications for the Generator conversion to N.G. I am still waiting on information from the manufacturer on the required installation requirements. PSEG will extend a high pressure line form Huber Street. Through value engineering, we revised the route of the PSEG gas line, new cost to PSEG has reduced from \$94,966.74 to \$75,720.04. Meeting with the manufacturer concerning design aspects of project, revising drawings according. SMUA sent PSEG check for high pressure line extension. PSEG to start gas line extension when recent snow is removed. High pressure line has been installed. Will seek a resolution to allow a sole source bidding process for the gas/diesel convertor. Specifications and Plans are being finalized for Bids in April 2016. Bids were published and will be accepted on April 29, 2016. Project was rebid due to excessive bid numbers. Rebid opening to be June 1, 2016

- O Still looking into a design to supply sanitary services to the Coast Guard Building. Designed a gravity system from the property line to a manhole on the trunk sanitary sewer in Meadowlands Parkway, waiting on an estimate from the contractor. Received an estimate for the gravity line, will look at a pump station with gravity line. Waiting on the estimate for the force main and pump station. Received information on the pump station, however, it has been revealed by the Town electrician that sufficient power is not available for a pump station and a new 3 phase service would need to be installed. Received quote for installation of a force main. Complying the costs of the force main, pump station installation and new power source. Submitted to Town for review. We have been contacted by the Building Department and the Mayor concerning this project. The Mayor has requested a meeting on this project. Waiting on his availability.
- O Spoke to the applicant's engineer about a proposed connection at 1 County Avenue. Reviewing application. Engineer received review letter and stated that the design may change. Unsuccessful attempt to return calls to Applicants permit engineer. Waiting on design plans from the applicant. Received plans and reviewed, issued comments back to the applicants engineer.
- O Contacted Tax Department to ascertain new tax maps for use by the Authority for facilities inventory. Waiting for meeting schedule. Will be attending a meeting at NJSIA on their GIA/Meri system. The tax department is waiting on a proposal from the Town to update the Tax Maps.
- O Met with PSEG concerning the possible expansion of the existing Solar Panel System. Sent elevations and cross section of the Primary Clarifier tanks to Contractor. Contractor will get back to us with their findings.
- O Excessive grease accumulated at the Turnpike PS, investigating. Also increase flow is being experienced at the Turnpike PS.
- O Spoke with National Watermain and others concerning a manhole lining/coating system for the collection system older brick man holes throughout the Town, especially the Clarendon Area. Also looking into the Predl rehabilitation system. Waiting on a date from a contractor to demonstrate a rehabilitation procedure.
- O Reviewing status of existing bucket chains and sprockets on Grit Chamber #3. Possible need to replace chains. Facility to order chains.
- O Started investigation to determine the capital cost for the replacement of the trickling filters plastic media. Estimated cost for delivery of Media is \$1,000,000 without installation or disposal of old media
- O Investigating the leaking of the plant water system by the secondary clarifier area. Also looking into a replacement for a 1-1/2" yard hydrant that has been deteriorated beyond use. Hydrant has been ordered, waiting on delivery. Additional conduit have been found that

- doesn't appear to be properly installed, will investigate. Contractor to return to repair the hydrant and uncover the conduit.
- O Prepared scope to replace roof on Pump Station #2/3 building and sent to three roofing contractors for quotes.
- O Reviewing information of revised project at 46 Meadowlands Parkway. Preliminary approval of flow numbers for a TWA application.
- O Reviewed contractors proposal to replace Primary Clarifier Tank #3 intake valve. Work to start June 1, 2016

- 1) The estimated average daily flow for the month was 2.6435 MGD. Maximum daily flow was 4.3504 M.G.; the estimated total flow for the month was 81.3445 MG.
- 2) Pumping Services conducted maintenance of the Flyght pumps located in Pump Station number three. The flushing valves are being refurbished.
- 3) The influent valve to Primary Clarifier number three failed. A new valve was ordered.
- 4) Biannual maintenance was conducted on the H.V.A.C system by Air Group Inc.
- 5) Routine maintenance and grounds keeping were performed.
- 6) The Serpentine tank was drained and cleaned.
- 7) The main emergency generator had yearly service conducted by Rodox Inc.
- 8) New rubber was installed on the Secondary Clarifier skimmer arms.
- 9) A new skimmer arm and rubber was installed in the Sludge Thickening Tank.
- 10) The Eye wash located in the Sludge Building was cleaned and repaired.
- 11) Two Manways were installed in the F.R.P. Odor control pipe just below the two blowers.
- 12) Packing was replaced on number one Primary Sludge Pump.
- 13) The exhaust fan located in the Generator room was repaired.
- 14) A new power cord was installed on the 2 inch Barnes pump.

PUMP STATION # 1 Village Place

- 1) The estimated average daily flow was 1.049 mgd.
- 2) All pumps cleaned and maintained on a regular basis.
- 3) Routine maintenance and grounds keeping were performed.
- 4) The generator was serviced by Rudox Inc.

PUMP STATION # 2 Paterson Plank Road and Turnpike Exit

1) The estimated average daily flow was 74,504 g.p.d..

- 2) Routine maintenance and grounds keeping were performed.
- 3) The Generator was serviced by Rudox Inc.

PUMP STATION # 3 Henry Street

- 1) The estimated average daily flow was 50,474 g.p.d.
- 2) Routine maintenance and grounds keeping were performed.
- 3) The Generator was services by Rodox Inc.

PUMP STATION # 4 New County Road and Seaview Drive

- 1) Routine maintenance was performed.
- 2) The Generator was serviced by Rudox Inc.

PUMP STATION # 5 Wilroy – Secaucus Road

1) This station is not in service. Grounds keeping was performed.

PUMP STATION # 6 Castle Road

- 1) Routine Maintenance and grounds keeping were performed.
- 2) The estimated average flow was 17,215g.p.d.
- 3) The Generator was serviced by Rudox Inc.

<u>PUMP STATION #7 - Exchange Junction</u>

- 2) The main gate to the Pump Station was repaired.
- 3) The Generator was serviced by Rudox Inc.
