#### **RESOLUTION 2016-08**

#### AUTHORIZING AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES WITH GREAT LAKES ENVIROMENTAL CENTER

**WHEREAS,** the Secaucus Municipal Utilities Authority (hereinafter "Authority") is a public body, duly formed under the Municipal and County Utilities Authority Law, constituting Chapter 183 of the Laws of 1957, as amended (Chapter 14B of Title 40 of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated) and possesses the powers set forth therein; and

WHEREAS, the Authority, along with certain other municipal and county sewerage utility authorities, have formed a consortium known as the New Jersey Harbor Dischargers Group (hereinafter "NJHDG") to address certain issues arising from various studies performed by the New York/New Jersey Harbor Estuary Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the NJHDG wishes to effectively address these issues and avoid the application of inappropriate effluent limitations for New Jersey dischargers by the Environmental Protection Agency (hereinafter "EPA") and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection; and

**WHEREAS**, the NJHDG desires to enter into a contract with Great Lakes Environmental Center (hereinafter "GLEC") to serve as Technical Advisor to the NJHDG, in accordance with its proposal dated June 3, 2016; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority agrees to be responsible for its pro-rata share {Attachment "A"}of any work at an estimated amount not to exceed \$11,229.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Local Public Contracts Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5) exempts the award of contracts for professional services from the requirements of public advertising and bidding; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority, as a member of the NJHDG, agrees to execute an agreement with GLEC to perform said services in accordance with its proposal; and

# NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF THE SECAUCUS MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY, as follows:

1. The Secaucus MUA Executive Director is hereby authorized and directed to execute the agreement with Great Lakes Environmental Center.

- 2. A notice of this action shall be published in the official newspaper of the Authority.
- 3. This contract is awarded in compliance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Executive Director is hereby authorized and empowered to take whatever action is necessary and execute any documents that may be required, on behalf of the Authority, after consultation with legal counsel, to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution.

# Report of the Executive Director July 2016 {July 28, 2016}

- In the process of installing a new bank of conduit for the secondary sludge pumps project. A dead short was detected between the secondary clarifiers and the main control panel. We are running five separate banks of conduit to correct this problem.
- Contract for the purchase and installation of the dual fuel converter has been awarded. Contractor I the process of pulling permits to proceed.
- Met with the Authority's Environmental/Regulatory Engineering firm PS&S and the Office of Homeland Security & Preparedness regarding some of the security system upgrades into the SCADA system. It was determined that technical specifications would be covered under the OHSP grant. Awaiting a formal proposal from PS&S; correspondence in the meeting package.
- Continued contact with the Town regarding the possible connection of the USCG Auxiliary building to the SMUA sanitary on Meadowland Parkway. Met with Councilman McKeever to go over cost proposals that the Authority presented to the Town several months ago.

- Glenn provided additional drawings for conduit runs for the SCADA installation.
- Had several conversations and emails with the members of the NJHDG to discuss plans moving forward to supply regulatory agencies with analytical data in an effort to prove a reduction in discharge limitations is appropriate and discussed the proposed contract. The Resolution regarding this contract is on tonight's agenda.
- The larvacide applied to reduce fly population has resulted in a drastic reduction of fly population.
- The replacement cost for the valve for the isolation of flow to primary clarifiers 3, 4 & 5 is \$22,500.00 for the valve only. Trying to obtain prices for the installation to put together a complete, formal quote.
- A meeting is scheduled for August 3, 2016 with Local 11 regarding labor negotiations.
- Received quotes for the replacement of the scum collection trough on the gravity sludge thickener. We will be awarding contract after document review. Two quotes received: (A) \$38,000.00 and (B) \$15,780.00.
- Registered for the Water Environment Federation Technical and Educational Conference, to take advantage of early registration discount. The conference takes place in September 2016.

## SECAUCUS MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY ENGINEER'S REPORT JULY 2016

The following is a list of the main activities as provided by this office to the Authority for the abovementioned month:

- O Bids were published and will be accepted on April 29, 2016. Project was rebid due to excessive bid numbers. Rebid opening to be June 1, 2016. The low responsible bidder was Envirocon from N.J. at \$119,000. Gathering the paper work from the Contractor to sign the contractor before the preconstruction meeting is held. Since the conversion equipment is more than a month to order and all other work will be done at that time, the preconstruction meeting will be held when the contractor receives the delivery date of the conversion kit.
- O Still looking into a design to supply sanitary services to the Coast Guard Building. We have complied the costs of to bid out either a force main/ pump station installation or a gravity system. Submitted the comparison information to the Town for review and input. The Mayor had requested a meeting on this project. Waiting on his availability.
- O Spoke to the applicant's engineer about a proposed connection at 1 County Avenue. Reviewing application. Engineer received review letter and stated that the design may change. Unsuccessful attempt to return calls to Applicants permit engineer. Waiting on design plans from the applicant. Received plans and reviewed, issued comments back to the applicants engineer. Revised plans have just been submitted, starting the review.
- O Contacted Tax Department to ascertain new tax maps for use by the Authority for facilities inventory. Waiting for meeting schedule. Will be attending a meeting at NJSEA on their GIA/Meri system. The tax department is waiting on a proposal from the Town to update the Tax Maps. We are also

meeting again with the NJSEA to gather information on use of their system and/or data.

- O Started investigation to determine the capital cost for the replacement of the trickling filters plastic media. Estimated cost for delivery of Media > \$1,000,000 without installation or disposal of old media.
- O Prepared scope to replace roof on Pump Station #2/3 building and sent to three roofing contractors for quotes.
- O Reviewing information of revised project at 46 Meadowlands Parkway. Preliminary approval of flow numbers for a TWA application. At this time the new facility will be utilizing the existing lateral form the old structure, therefore, no review is required on installation.
- O 2 Secondary sludge pumps burnt out due to a shorted power feed. A rental pump was installed along with a temporary pump feed cable from the panel in the sludge building to the clarifier. We are acquiring proposals to install new conduit and feed wiring between the panel and the clarifier. Conduit has been installed. Waiting on the electrician to install the new wiring.
- O Preparing a scope to supply and install the scum collecting "beach" within the sludge thickener tank. The SMUA will empty and clean the tank with the contractor doing the remaining work. We will also be replacing a 6" eccentric ball valve at the bottom of the tank since it will be empty and out of service. Prepared a RFP and uploaded it to the SMUA web page. Held a prebid meeting with three contractors in attendance. Two contractors bid with Rapid pump and meter Services being the lowest at \$15,780.00. Second bidder was \$38,000.00.
- O Responded to a request to locate SMUA facilities within two areas County Road/New County Road intersection and Penhorn Avenue/Secaucus Road intersection for the proposed Gateway-Trans Hudson Partnership Amtrak Tunnel Project (GTHPATP). Sent the GTHPATP sketches with the approximate location of sewer lines and elevations within their requested zone.
- O Met with representatives for the proposed Hudson County Technical School to be located on New County Road. Produced Estimated flow letter for the Authority and Applicant. Started technical review.
- O Met with Chuck Cuyulis on the proposed SCADA project. Started preparing facility layouts and the conduit design runs. Sent Chuck Cuyulis preliminary plans for review and markup.
- O A "Change of Use" has been submitted for 4 Emerson Lane. The applicant is converting 8,000 sf of existing warehouse into a digital printing operation. The applicant has explained the new equipment will only produce 2,500 gpd of rinse water accomplished by an evaporation/condensation system that would be free of any ink. The only way ink could enter the system is by a malfunction. I am requesting further information on the new equipment with respect to the water usage and discharge.

- 1) The estimated average daily flow for the month was 2.6035 MGD. Maximum daily flow was 5.0279 M.G.; the total estimated flow for the month was 80.83 MG...
- 2) The exhaust fan for the Sludge Blower room was repaired.
- 3) The shear pin was replaced on the drive unit of the settling zone of Primary Clarifier number 3.
- 4) Six (6) new flyghts were installed in the old aeration zone of Primary Clarifier number three.
- 5) Routine maintenance and grounds keeping were performed.
- 6) The Serpentine tank was drained and cleaned.
- 7) New electrical conduit was installed from the Sludge Building to the Secondary Clarifiers for the sludge pumps. A new A.B.S. sludge pump has arrived on site. We are awaiting installation after the Electrician installs new power supply to the Secondary Sludge pumps. Hugerich Construction excavated the trench for the conduit.
- 8) Quotes have been received for the repair of the Sludge Thickening Tank Scum Trough.
- 9) New plywood ramps have installed over foam spray piping located on the Post Aeration Tank.
- 10) The Sodium Hypochlorite feed line was replaced on Odor Control tower number one.
- 11) Plant boilers were inspected by C.N.A. insurance.
- 12) A leak on sodium hypochlorite pump number two was repaired.
- 13) The sodium hypochlorite feed pump located in the wet well of Pump Station number one was replaced.

## PUMP STATION # 1 Village Place

- 1) The estimated average daily flow was 1.0085 mg.
- 2) All pumps cleaned and maintained on a regular basis.
- 3) Routine maintenance and grounds keeping were performed

## PUMP STATION # 2 Paterson Plank Road and Turnpike Exit

- 1) The estimated average daily flow was 68,516 g.p.d...
- 2) Routine maintenance and grounds keeping were performed.

## PUMP STATION # 3 Henry Street

- 1) The estimated average daily flow was 53,107 g. p. d.
- 2) Routine maintenance and grounds keeping were performed.

## PUMP STATION # 4 New County Road and Seaview Drive

1) Routine maintenance was performed.

## PUMP STATION # 5 Wilroy – Secaucus Road

1) This station is not in service. Grounds keeping was performed.

# PUMP STATION # 6 Castle Road

- 1) Routine Maintenance and grounds keeping were performed.
- 2) The estimated average flow was 22,956 g.p.d.
